Submit your Manuscript

Include a cover letter with a brief description of your writing background and any specific feedback you would like, as well as all contact information including an email address.

Manuscripts must follow strict submission guidelines: typed in 12-point font, on one side of the page only (prose -- double-spaced, not exceeding 15 pages, poetry -- single-spaced, not exceeding six poems).

From October 2, 2017 to March 16, 2018, manuscripts for review can be emailed to wpl.writerinres@gmail.com or a copy can be dropped off at the Reader Services desk at Millennium Library or mailed to: Writer-in-Residence, Reader Services, 251 Donald Street, Winnipeg, MB R3C 3P5.
