During "I Love to Read" month in February we will host a "Tin for the bin" campaign to encourage users to donate goods. Winnipeg Harvest staff are providing a bin for each WPL branch and will pick up donated goods as requested.

d. Freedom to Read

6. Program Highlights

a. Podcast

WPL launched its Time to Read podcast in February. Monthly titles are selected and readers can send in questions and comments as they read along to the Podcast group. Some of the questions / comments may be featured when the podcast is recorded. Margaret Atwood's Oryx and Crake was the first selection.

b. Festival du Voyageur

Festival du Voyageur is the largest winter festival in Western Canada. The Winnipeg Public Library, Saint-Boniface Library branch is excited to be participating in Festival for the first time. The library will be set up in the La Prairie tent, a children's entertainment tent, from 10 am to 2 pm on February 17, 18, 19, 24 and 25. We will be offering a pop-up library, a variety of voyageur and Métis themed crafts as well as 2 sessions of bilingual family story times per day. The staff are getting ready for a very busy, fun-filled Festival experience!

c. Facebook Live

WPL staff have been finding ways to share programming outside our library walls. One way is to live stream programming on Facebook. It helps current library users attend programs if they are unable to come down and to capture potential new audiences. Check out the WPL Facebook page for announcements on which programs will be live streamed. The next scheduled program is on February 14, 2018 12:10 p.m. – 12:50 p.m. with Kevin Brownlee, Curator of Archeology at the Manitoba Museum who will talk about Pisim Revitalizing and Reclaiming Rocky Cree Culture, Identify and History

d. Sensory Storytime

For the first time WPL is offering a family sensory story time which will feature books, songs and movement activities in an input-sensitive environment. This interactive program is geared toward children ages 3-5, including children on the Autism spectrum, and their parents/caregivers (and siblings). This new type of story time hopes to reduce barriers and be more inclusive to children and their families.

7. Changes to Digital Resources

Library customers have 24/7 access to WPL's eLibrary and can access eBooks, eAudiobooks, movies, music, magazines and more. We made some changes this year as a result of an RFP for the provision of digital media services:

- Downloadable and streaming eBooks and eAudiobooks are available through OverDrive and RBdigital. We no longer offer eAudiobooks through Hoopla.
- Downloadable and streaming movies and TV shows will continue to be available through Hoopla, as well as OverDrive.
- Beginning February 9, 2018, we will also be offering streaming videos Kanopy, which offers thousands of
 documentary film festival movies and feature films especially prized by cinephiles including the Criterion
 Collection. Streaming full-length music albums are available through Hoopla.
- For those with more classical/folk/world/jazz tastes, we offer access to Naxos Jazz and Naxos Music Library.
- We also offer more than 150 full-colour cover-to-cover issues of weekly and monthly magazines through both RBdigital (formerly called Zinio) and Flipster.
- Since January 1, we no longer offer the following eLibrary resources: Mango Languages, Qikan, Grolier's Multimedia Encyclopedia, It's Your Job, My Canada, eEnglish by Pronunciation Power, and Freading.
