#### 7. Adult Programming and Outreach Update

• The Assiniboia Indian Residential School display continues its rotation to library locations. The display was installed at the SWST library for July-August and will be installed at Cornish Library for September-October. An estimated 2,398 members of the public have viewed this display to date. The Assiniboia Indian Residential School, located at 615 Academy Road in Winnipeg, was in operation from 1958 until June, 1973. Discover the hidden history and stories of some of the graduates and survivors in this nine-panel exhibit.

Developed in partnership with the City of Winnipeg's Indigenous Relations Division and Planning, Property, and Development.

Special thanks to the graduates and survivors of the Assiniboia Residential School for sharing their story.

- The Adult Summer Reading Challenge concluded Friday, September 2. Ballots are being drawn for one prize per location to participants who completed a library-themed activity (e.g.: read a book by an Indigenous author, view an award-winning film on Kanopy).
- Fall is the time to save seeds for the next year. Osborne and Cornish libraries are hosting **Seed Libraries** for community members to leave and take seeds.
- **Book Clubs** are back! Many libraries are welcoming registrants to their in-person book clubs to discuss interesting titles. This is one great example of how libraries are regaining their place as community social hubs.
- Additional programs for September include Family law: what are my options? Introduction to Eastern European Genealogy, Tips on decluttering, and many more!
- The Mobile Library continues biweekly visits to Blake Garden's Neighbourhood Centre, and to Indigenous Family Centre.
- Outreach staff are also scheduled to present on the library at Addictions Foundation of Manitoba, and to the seniors at The Enclave.
- Staff continue to promote the library at large, outdoor community festivals in September. The Book Bike will be at **ManyFest** at Broadway and Memorial Blvd, bringing library information, and a collection of material to browse and borrow on Saturday, September 10 and Sunday, September 11.
- Look for the WPL tent at Sherbrook Street Festival, on Saturday, September 10. Staff will be making library cards on-the-spot, have a book display, provide bookmarks with upcoming program information and colouring sheets for children. Invitations to WPLB and LAC members to volunteer will be sent out shortly. Staff counted 140 interactions with the public at this event in 2021. And 150 interactions in 2019!

Met with the **2022/2023 Writer-in-Residence**. Formal announcement will be made this month. Program start October 1, 2022 and runs until April 20, 2023. #### 8. Youth Services Update

- The annual TD Summer Reading Club will end on September 2. TD SRC is for children of all interests, ages and abilities and is designed and developed to inspire kids to explore the fun of reading while reducing summer learning loss.
- Registration for the first of two Fall Early Literacy Sessions opened on August 29.
  The first Fall Early Literacy Session will run September 19-October 28 and
  includes 60 early literacy sessions (Baby Rhyme Time, Toddler Time, and Family
  Story Time). All programs are in-person and registration is required. The second
  Fall Session will run November 14 December 16 and registration will open on
  October 17.
- We are pleased to celebrate Science Literacy Week September 19-24. 15 science-based programs for school age and pre-school children will be offered over the course of this week. A new booklist has been created and will accompany science-themed book displays for children and their families in branches. Thanks to the Friends of the Winnipeg Public Library for their support of Science Literacy Week programming.
- Two Indigenous Language learning sessions will be offered for children and their families this Fall. Ininímowin (Cree) for Families at Transcona Library and Anishinaabemowin (Ojibwe) for Families at Bill and Helen Norrie Library. Classes run on Saturdays from September 17 – October 22 and registration is required. Thank you to the Winnipeg Public Library Board for their support of Indigenous language programming this Fall.

### 9. Ukrainian refugees

Aug 27 family event with targeted activities in Ukrainian (approximately 60 in attendance) – developed in collaboration with community partner at St. Anne Ukrainian Church – serves as a follow-up to Aug 5 card sign-up at HEND for 70 children from newly arrived Ukrainian families

### 10. Community Connections Update

- Opened April 25
- As of mid-August, over 5,700 visits (200 600 per week) during hours half of Millennium Library Hours
- Over 30 different visiting agencies have been in the space. Visit agencies can connect with library customers and provide information/services.
