1. Facilities Update

a) Millennium Library:

Safety & Security

b) St. John's Library

3. World Languages Study

The final report for the Winnipeg Public Library's world languages collection study was submitted in early 2020. The report includes a series of recommendations and strategies in order to ensure that the collection is relevant, accessible, and sustainable. A working group was struck in 2022 to begin studying and implementing the study recommendations, lead by Barbara Bourrier-LaCroix.

Next steps planned for 2023: begin the work necessary for a RFP to find a vendor or vendors to provide us with the fully-catalogued materials requested, exploring funding opportunities to catalogue our existing collections, and working with the marketing team to improve signage and promote the collections.

4. Indigenous Subject Headings

In 2022, cataloguing staff began work on a multi-year project to update subject headings used in the Library's catalogue to describe Indigenous/Indigenous-related titles. The subject headings traditionally used by libraries to describe Indigenous/Indigenous-related content are based on settler colonial viewpoints of Indigenous Peoples, their experiences, and their knowledges. A number of these subject headings use language that is inaccurate, offensive, or otherwise dated. A common example of this is the subject heading "Indians of North America".

Winnipeg Public Library acknowledges that undertaking this project is only possible because of generations of Indigenous Peoples – including Traditional Knowledge keepers and Indigenous librarians and other cultural workers – who have advocated for accurate and respectful representation of their nations and cultures within settler colonial libraries and archives. WPL's current project is being carried out in the context of a national effort in libraries across Canada to contribute to Truth and Reconciliation efforts by addressing cataloguing that is not acceptable.

We estimate that it will take approximately two years to complete this project. There are approximately 1,000 subject headings that include the term "Indians of North America" only, and an unknown number of other Indigenous-related terms such as "Indians, Treatment of", "Older Indians", and "Names, Native" to name a few. Some

aspects of the project involve work that is ongoing and additional work will be required as subject headings continue to evolve.

5. Maker-in-Residence

Two individuals have been selected and will start in-person activities the week of January 9th. The diversity and talent in the applicant pool was very impressive and we have several candidates who we were unable to select in this round but would make excellent residents in future versions of the program.

6. Adult Programming and Outreach Update

Westwood Library's **Ukelele Jam** program holds its first ever meeting Tuesday, December 13. Library staff and other ukulele players will get together for a monthly jam session of popular songs.

Tales at Night returns to Good Will Social Club on Wednesday, December 21. Adults can enjoy their own "Storytime" as they listen to tales read aloud by WPL librarians. Forty people attended our last visit to Good Will, to enjoy the readings, receive or update their library card, and borrow library material.

There are currently 14 **Book Clubs** offered at various library locations. Some clubs focus on Adult Fiction titles, some on mysteries, or cookbooks. Some are in-person, some are online. There's a Book Club for all tastes!

Join in the festive fun at Osborne Library's **Cookie Cutter Swap**, or find a fun family activity at Transcona Library's **Puzzle Swap**.

Genealogy and various other programming can be found on the library's online Program & Events calendar.

Outreach staff continue biweekly Mobile Library visits to high poverty neighbourhoods. Outreach staff will also be presenting on library resources at Addiction Foundation of Manitoba, RRC Polytech, and MITT Quest in December.

In the spirit of this Holiday Season, Community Services staff will be supporting the *Accueil francophone du Manitoba's* Fête de Noël, a celebration that welcomes refugee families from a variety of countries, being held on December 18, 2022. WPL will be staffing a library information table and distributing free books to an expected

300 newcomer children. Thank You Winnipeg Public Library Board for funding WPL's giveaway book collection.

7. Youth Services Update

- The second 5-week Fall Early Literacy Session is currently taking place, and includes 60 early literacy sessions (Baby Rhyme Time, Toddler Time, Family Story Time). The session runs from November 14 December 17.
- The first 5-week Winter Early Literacy Session will run January 16 February 18, with registration opening December 12. It will include 63 early literacy sessions (Baby Rhyme Time, Toddler Time, Family Story Time).
- On November 1st WPL hosted author and Keeper of the Grey Cup Jeff McWhinney at Munroe Library for a discussion of his book *Not Without My Teammates* with grade 3 and 4 students from Hampstead School. Jeff McWhinney generously provided a copy of his book to each student at Hampstead School.
- Looking ahead Take Your Child to the Library Days are happening in February at all 20 branches, with parents and caregivers invited to visit the library with their children for library card sign-ups and a variety of programming including musical performances. Thank you to the Friends of the Winnipeg Public Library for supporting the Take Your Child to the Library Days programming.

Appendix C

Summary Discussion October 5, 2021 re: Land and Water Acknowledgment

- City of Winnipeg Indigenous Relations Divisions (IRD) has provided the current wording as a starting point, but the IRD encourages individuals/organizations to make changes if it remains respectful of the relationships with the land, water, Treaties, and Indigenous Peoples
- Would not be required to consult with IRD provided that the Library Board/reader is respectful in their words and meaning
- Suggestion received that Library Board members take turns reading the Land Acknowledgement to experience reading a Land Acknowledgement
- Furthermore, the Assistant at the meeting and the Executive Committee stated that Land and Water Acknowledgement provided by the Indigenous staff of the City is suggested wording and could change provided that the change is meaningful in terms of what is felt by the individual who is speaking the words
- Changes could apply also if an Indigenous Board member was saying the acknowledgment as the words would be different for them and they may also opt to share additional words to bring together the relationships acknowledged
- The Indigenous staff recognize that they do not speak for the whole Indigenous community but their work is part of reconciliation efforts to help people along their journey, especially recognizing everyone is at different stages of their reconciliation journey and take different paths
