## 4. Youth Services Update

February was I Love to Read Month and Take Your Child to the Library Days
programming took place at all 20 branches. Over 900 attendees participated in
37 programs with over 600 attendees at the Family Performances that took place
on Saturdays (Feb. 4, 11, 18, 25) including 75 at the Millennium Library

- performance. Thank you to the Friends of the Winnipeg Public Library for supporting the Take Your Child to the Library Days programming.
- During Take Your Child to the Library Days there were 559 new children's library card registrations across 20 facilitates.
- The first Winter Early Literacy Session (January 16-February 18) included 292 programs over 5 weeks with a total of 4,943 attendees.
- The second Winter <u>Early Literacy Session</u> will run March 6 25. It will include 62 early literacy sessions (Baby Rhyme Time, Toddler Time, Family Story Time).
   The Spring Early Literacy Session will run April 17 May 20, with registration opening March 20.
- The newly updated Racism and Anti-Racism Booklist for Children and Teens is now available on the website. Select titles will be featured in displays for the International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (March 21).
- <u>Spring Break (March 25-April 1) Programs</u> include 40 programs for families, school age children, and teens.

#### 5. Adult Programming and Outreach Update

- Winter 2023's Skywalk Lecture Series concludes this month with award-winning poet (and former WPL Writer in Residence) Di Brandt presenting her recently published poetry collection The Sweetest Dance on Earth. And speaking of the Writer in Residence, this month the Time to Read podcast team will be discussing this year's WiR Frances Koncan's play Women of the Fur Trade. Thank you to the Winnipeg Public Library Board for being a co-sponsor of the Writer in Residence program.
- Online programs to celebrate spring include Seed Starting with Barb Ediger, former president of Sustainable South Osborne Community Co-op, and Traditional Plants: uses, gardening, storing, and seed harvesting with Marlene Gallagher. Offered in partnership with the Treaty Relations Commission of Manitoba.
- In-person programs include Tales at Night at the Goodwill Social Club, The Art
  of Comics Lettering, Researching the History of Your House, and many
  more.
- Makers in Residence Osani Balkaran and Sean McLachlan round out their tenure with a series of in-person, hands-on programs: Design a Postcard, Introduction to Relief Printing, Learn about Beat Making, and Lyric Writing. Last week 60 enthusiastic students from Victor Mager School visited the ideaMILL makerspace to create under the guidance of our resident maker artists.
- Outreach staff are scheduled to make presentations and / or deliver library card signups at: Red River College Polytech's Language Training Centre (EAL students), Enhanced Skills for Employment (provides language upgrading to skilled immigrants), Taking Charge! (Taking Charge! helps more than 200 single

parents and women enter into a full-time education program each year to attain their Mature Grade 12 education while caring for their kids in a fully subsidized and licensed daycare), and more.
