10. Millennium Library Update

- On Dec 11, 2022 Tyree Cayer was attacked at the Millennium Library and passed away from their injuries.
- After this tragic loss of life, the library remained closed until Dec 23 and opened to counter service only.
- On Jan 23, the building fully re-opened with interim security measures.
 - o Walk-through metal detector gate

- Additional security guards
- Additional Community Safety Host
- Two Winnipeg Police Service Officers on-site during regular operating hours
- A comprehensive risk and security audit was conducted, and library administration are waiting for the final report from GardaWorld Security, who was hired as the 3rd party consultant.
 - o Recommendations will be reviewed and evaluated.
 - Actions that will be considered will have a comprehensive plan developed including budget implications for Council's consideration.
- Community Connections remains closed but work to re-open is in progress.
- We acknowledge that the interim measures are not supported by everyone, however we are trying to achieve a balanced approach to ensure everyone's physical, emotional, and psychological needs are met.
- Trauma-informed, non-violent de-escalation and empathy-based service delivery training is being planned for staff.

Q: What is the City doing to communicate information to the public?

A: The City issues news releases for significant changes or initiatives and responds to inquiries from media.

Q: Is there funding for library staff for Community Connections?

A: Since opening in April 2022, there has not been incremental funding to staff Community Connections. Staff working in the space are from the other service areas at Millennium Library.

Q: What do staff do in Community Connections?

A: Provide assistance using Winnipeg Public Library and provide resources and referrals to help connect people with support for basic needs such as food, housing, employment, benefits.

Q: Is there a timeline for when GardaWorld will have the report completed and report given to Council?

A: A draft report has been received but there is no timeline to finalize.

Q: Is there anything confidential you are sharing with us?

A: No, all information shared at this meeting has either been released to the media and/or staff.

Q: Is there an opportunity to reallocate funds for security to the Community Safety Host program?

A: Winnipeg Public Library is committed to the Community Safety Host program; however, the current security budget is insufficient to hire hosts. In addition, various approaches are required (contract security guards and community safety hosts).

Q: Have heard that individuals or families do not feel comfortable in libraries. Are there plans for any public engagement to determine how library users and citizens feel?

A: Winnipeg Public Library would like to have more public engagement opportunities. There are varying perceptions about what the library is meant to (e.g., providing traditional library services or being the bridge to gap the unmet needs of society)

Q: Is there opportunities of satellite libraries if customers do not or cannot visit a library branch?

A: Outreach staff go offsite to bring services to underserved communities. Demand for this service outweighs the capacity to deliver.

3. Youth Services Update

- The <u>Spring Early Literacy Session</u> will run April 17 May 20, registration opened March 20.
- <u>Spring Break (March 25-April 1) Programs</u> included 40 programs for families, school age children, and teens. Attendance statistics are being compiled.
- An Our City, Our Stories feature about free activities to keep kids busy during spring break was published on March 22.

- Planning for the TD Summer Reading Club and Teen Summer Reading Challenge is well underway. Teen and TD SRC will run June 12-September 1.

4. Adult Programming and Outreach Update

This year, WPL embarked on our first **Makers-in-Residence Program** and two local artists joined us on this journey. Our Makers-in-Residence have been busy offering drop-in programs, workshops, and working throughout their residencies on their collaborative projects. Each project showcases their artistry and brings the voices of Winnipeg's citizens together through their mediums. Starting in April, check out the exhibit featuring postcards designed and printed by participants in collaboration with Sean McLachlan, as well as a soundscape developed by Osani Balkaran. All creative activities asked participants to reflect on their experience during the pandemic.

Jean-Pierre Noël from the Centre du patrimoine presents two genealogy programs this month. **Métis Genealogy** at Millennium Library, and the same program *en français* at St. Boniface Library. Participants will learn about online and archival resources available to individuals researching their Métis ancestry in Manitoba.

April sees the launch of a new staff-led, online program: **Next Page Live!** – participants can view library staff talking about their favourite fiction and non-fiction and join in by sharing their own recommendations in the chat.

Time to Read Podcast's discussion of *Tatouine* by Jean-Christophe Réhel will be released Friday, April 7. This title is also <u>One eRead Canada's</u> pick for 2023 and is available to download in digital format without any waitlists through our OverDrive and Cantook Station services, from April 1 to April 30.

The mobile laptop lab will be at Charleswood Library in April to provide **computer workshops** including Excel, Introduction to the Computer, and Email Basics.

Additional Online Programs include Perspectives Book Club, Know Your Rights for Seniors, and Saving Money at the Grocery Store.

Additional In-person Programs include Library and Archives Canada: Consult with an Archivist (book a 30-minute appointment to discuss your genealogy research questions), and Crafting Comedy: Humour as a Tool of Decolonization (with Writerin-Residence Frances Koncan).

Public Service

Cindy Fernandes

Cindy has worked for the City of Winnipeg for over 30 years. As a Chartered Professional Accountant (CPA), she also holds a Bachelor of Commerce Honors degree and Masters in Municipal Leadership. Beginning with the former Boards of Commissioners, she moved through various positions in the Corporate Finance department prior to joining the Community Services department in 2001. Cindy has been Director of the Community Services department since 2017 and is a member of the End Homelessness Winnipeg (EHW) and Immigration Partnership Winnipeg (IPW) Board of Directors. In addition, Cindy is the public service lead on the Human Rights Committee of Council and directed the creation of the Newcomer Welcome and Inclusion Policy and the Poverty Reduction Strategy for the City of Winnipeg.

Writer-in-Residence (WIR) 2022/2023

Frances Koncan

Frances Koncan is an innovative, award-winning Anishinaabe playwright and director whose works have been produced on stages across the country, including the Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre (RMTC). She has helped emerging writers and playwrights develop their voices as Writer-in-Residence at the University of Manitoba and as a mentor with RMTC, and her play *Space Girl* just premiered at Prairie Theatre Exchange. She has also worked as a freelance journalist and arts consultant.

- Met with writers primary online, but also had meetings via phone and in-person.
- To date about 30 writers have contacted Frances; more submissions are being received.

- Appreciated that the program is reachable to other writers in the Province and not limited to Winnipeg residences.
- Some of the writers had received feedback from previous WIR; it was beneficial to see other WIR feedback and see the evolution of the aspiring writers.
- Offering monthly writing circles which is a program that meets with people and may cover sensitive and challenging topics.
- Preparing 2 programs that will focus on decolonization in writing and will be offered at St. John's and Cornish Libraries
- Frances thanks the program and Library Services' staff for supporting the time needed to work on Space Girl play.

Q: Is the WIR program valuable?

A: Yes. It gives writers a chance to connect with community and people. There are other WIR programs, however since the program is associated with the public library it increases access to aspiring writers. In addition, it allows for previous aspiring writers to come back to the program on a yearly basis and obtain different perspectives from other WIR.

Community Safety Host Program (CSH)

Mary Burton

Mary Burton has been a dedicated advocate for families and youth in Winnipeg's North End for over 30 years. As a Cree woman, she has advised governments on child welfare policies and serves on national and international boards. In 2014, Mary cofounded Fearless R2W, an organization that helps families navigate Manitoba's child welfare system. As the Executive Director, Mary also plays a crucial role in decision making for the Community Safety Hosts Initiative.

Daniel Waycik

With over a decade of experience in the nonprofit and community sectors, **Daniel**Waycik has led programs that focus on operations development, safety, and wellbeing. Specializing in facilitating collaboration between multiple organizations and leveraging existing capacities, they are currently working on long-term projects with three Manitoba nonprofits, supporting them in understanding and navigating development of security and safety programs that share goals with different community stakeholders. Daniel currently serves as the steward Program Manager for the Community Safety Hosts Initiative.

- Thanks was given to Mary and Daniel for their presentation at the Executive Policy Committee on March 16 in advocating for Winnipeg Public Library and the Community Safety Host program.
- Community Safety Host program was a result of a 2019 University of Manitoba housing solutions lab.
- The CSH program is a collaborative program that is available to individuals who reside in the North End, have lived experience, and/or are aging out of care.
- CSH provides standard security training but also offers trauma-informed, compassionate, and de-escalating training.
- The program is intertwined with Indigenous ways which helps with interacting with people and connecting people to resources or providing help customers need.
- Mary and Daniel provided thanks to the Library Board for providing funding in 2021 and 2022 to assist with training costs and request for continued support.
