1. Facilities Update

a) Millennium Library Carpeting and Lighting Upgrade

- Work has been completed
- All floors are now open to the public during regular business hours
- The 4th floor has new service desk, relocated for improved sightlines by staff for a safer space. Public computers have been replaced in a layout with added space between customers, with the intent of reducing interpersonal conflict.

- RFP 847-2022 1x1 Architecture has been awarded contract
- Will be working on current building condition assessment and feasibility study

2. Recruitment Update

Winnipeg Public Library continues to fill vacancies. Current opportunities can be found on the city of Winnipeg's website <u>https://legacy.winnipeg.ca/hr/default.stm</u>

3. Youth Services Update

- The TD Summer Reading Club and Teen Summer Reading Challenge will run June 12-September 1. Beginning June 12 children 0-12 can receive their free bilingual reading kit and teens their summer reading challenge card at any library branch. TD SRC is for kids of all interests, ages, and abilities.
- Beginning June 12 families can register for summer programs for children, teens, and families taking place July 3 September 1.
- Spring Break (March 27-April 1) included 47 programs for families, school age children, and teens. Total attendance 1,072. Many thanks to the Friends of the Winnipeg Public Library for their support of spring break programming.
- The <u>Spring Early Literacy Session</u> runs April 17-May 20, registration opened March 20.

The first Winter Early Literacy Session (January 16 - February 18) included 292 programs over 5 weeks with a total of 4,943 attendees. The second Winter Early Literacy Session (March 6 – March 25) included 181 programs over 3 weeks with a total of 3,304 attendees.

4. Adult Programming and Outreach Update

- Heritage Winnipeg's **Doors Open Winnipeg** is a free annual event held on the last weekend of May. Once again, Cornish Library will open *its* doors for the public to enjoy the building's historical architecture.
- **Book-to-Movie** screenings return to Millennium Library. Sunday, May 14ths film is Agatha Christie's classic *Death on the Nile* (2022 version starring Kenneth Branagh as Hercule Poirot).
- Join us for a keynote with Joan Thomas and creative writing workshops related to climate change at **Inside the Writer's Mind: Writing Climate Change.** Presented in partnership with the *Winnipeg International Writer's Festival*.
- COVID in the House of Old exhibit runs from May 2 through to May 13. 7,609 seniors in Canadian care homes died of COVID over its first seven months. This exhibit presents powerful stories of frustration, outrage, care, love, and grief, tracing fault lines that COVID revealed in our eldercare system. You can share your memories and thoughts in our Story Space. Be part of a national project of acknowledging and reflecting. Help imagine a better future for our caregivers, our elders, and ourselves.
- May's Time to Read podcast pick is *The Bluest Eye* by Toni Morrison. Discussions take place on social media (we even have our own Facebook group!). And you can always send your questions and thoughts to <u>wpl-</u> <u>podcast@winnipeg.ca</u>.
- Participate in a beginner session of **Sitting Tai Chi**. Those with limited mobility are welcome to attend.
- **Companion gardening** with Dr. Eva Pip. Promote harmony in your garden by recognizing which plants get along, and which ones cannot stand each other!
- May 5th is the National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls and Two-Spirited Peoples. To honour the day all Winnipeg Public Libraries will have red dresses on display from May 5 through to May 17.
