3. World Languages Report Update

In 2019, the <u>Winnipeg Public Library Board commissioned a study</u> of our world languages collection, which identified a series of recommendations to improve the collection.

A working group began work to implement the study recommendations. By studying 2021 census language data, newcomer information and material circulation statistics, the working group determined which languages in the collection are relevant, accessible, and sustainable moving forward.

Based on all of this information, Winnipeg Public Library will offer materials in the following languages: Amharic, Arabic, Bengali, Chinese, Farsi, German, Gujarati, Hindi, Italian, Korean, Polish, Portuguese, Punjabi, Russian, Somali, Spanish, Swahili, Tagalog, Tigrinya, Ukrainian, Urdu and Vietnamese.

In June 2023 WPL awarded contracts to two vendors to supply us with materials in these languages, and most importantly, with full MARC cataloguing records in the original language. We have begun to receive new materials, and full cataloguing records in the online catalogue. This means that borrowers can now search and place holds on individual titles.

The following languages will no longer be available at Winnipeg Public Library: Bosnia, Croatian, Finnish, Greek, Hebrew, Hmong, Hungarian, Icelandic, Japanese, Kurdish, Nepali, Oromo, Serbian, Swedish, Tamil, Thai and Turkish. Staff will weed the language collections no longer in circulation and will connect with community organizations or individuals who may be interested in these materials.

4. Youth Services Update

Our 8-week Fall Early Literacy Session is running from September 18-November 10 and includes 70 early literacy sessions (Baby Rhyme Time, Toddler Time, and Family Story Time). To date, over 6,000 attendees were recorded. Registration for the Winter Early Literacy Session will open on December 11 and will run for 8 weeks from January 22-March 16.

Youth Services Librarians delivered a 3.5-hour Early Literacy Program Training Session on October 18, which was attended by 17 staff members across the division.

Millennium Library has been hosting a 3-session Teen Comic Workshop with GMB Chomichuk for teens in grades 7-12 that has been extremely successful.

Over the summer, WPL held both the World Storytelling Series program and the World Language Story Time program. Please see the attached report. WPL will be running an additional 5 sessions of World Language Story Time during the month of November. Charleswood and West Kildonan will host the Ukrainian program;

Harvey Smith and St. John's will host the Filipino program; and Louis Riel will host the Spanish program. Many thanks to the Board for their support of this program!

5. Adult Programming Update

Community Connections reopened on Monday, October 30. Initial hours are 10 am - 2 pm expanding to full hours on Wednesday, November 15. The space has a capacity limit for best personalized service experience with one Community Crisis Worker, a library staff person, and two Community Safety Hosts at any one time. Visiting agencies continue to be booked into the space and the lobby area. The schedule is posted on the Community Connections website. Learn more about Community Connections at winnipeg.ca/communityconnections.

Upcoming programs in November **for adults** include Skywalk Concerts and Lectures series and film screenings at Millennium Library, and several online programs including estate planning, and Perspectives Online Book Club. Branches are hosting book talks, ornament making, puzzle swaps and cookie cutter swaps. The Time to Read Podcast for November is *Gilead* by Marilynne Robinson. Review the What's On guide at winnipeg.ca/library or browse the online program calendar for all the events.

Millennium and St. John's Libraries have been hosting red dress pin making workshops with Gerri Lee Pangman. The session introduces the meaning of MMIWG2S+, the Calls for Justice and Gerri's personal story. Participants are taught how to bead step by step. These have been well received and the last session is November 18 at St. John's Library. All WPLB members are welcome to attend. There is registration, space can be made available. 6. Outreach Services Update

Outreach Services continues to be busy with its mobile library program and community presentations and pop-up events. The Mobile Library has 3 locations that are visited every 2 weeks with books to borrow and activities - Blake Gardens Resource Centre (312 Blake), Marlene Street Resource Centre (27 Marlene St.) and Indigenous Families Centre (470 Selkirk Ave). Some of the other places Outreach is visiting this month are: St. Amant Centre, Addictions Foundation of Manitoba, Taking Charge, and a Seniors Healthcare Fair.

7. Book Sale at Millennium Library

Starting on November, 14 Millennium Library will be restarting their book sales. The book sale will be located on the main floor in the New and Noted area.

Appendix D

November 7, 2023 Public Library Service Update

- Trevor Surgenor, Director of the Manitoba PLS unit explained that one of the strategic actions in Manitoba's Culture Policy and Action plan was to review the public library funding model and realign provincial funding to develop a strong and sustainable public library sector.
- He provided background on provincial consultation and engagement processes on provincial funding policy for both rural and northern public libraries as well as

the Winnipeg Public Library. Public libraries, their municipal representatives and key sector stakeholders including Manitoba's Public Library Advisory Board, the Manitoba Library Association, Association of Manitoba Municipalities, and the Association of Manitoba Bilingual Municipalities provided input and feedback on a new provincial funding approach.

- He shared information and provided clarity on the new Public Library Allocation
 of Grants Regulation which comes into effect on April 1, 2024. He noting that
 under the new model in Winnipeg Public Library would be eligible for up to \$4
 million in provincial funding which is calculated using a formula that considers
 15% of the total expenditures in the previous calendar year on library collection
 materials and salaries of library staff plus an additional \$10,000 for each FTE
 credentialed librarian.
- He shared projections based on the 2023 budget information, noting that in 2024
 the provincial funding formula could result in an increase to WPL representing
 approximately \$1 million dollars but this amount will be confirmed by the actual
 audited expenditures. Trevor also explained that all previous funding streams to
 WPL which include the operating grant and targeted funding for programs
 (World Language blocks, Writer in Residence Program and funding for
 accessible library technologies) are consolidated under the new formula.
- When asked if the information presented was part of a public announcement,
 Trevor explained that the intention of discussing the new Regulation with the
 Winnipeg Public Library Board and all public libraries in Manitoba is to provide
 clarity and support the 2024 budgeting processes. He noted that government will
 consider its broader public communications strategies separately.
