Harry and Craig are two seventeen-year-olds who take part in a 32-hour marathon of kissing to set a new Guinness World Record. (2013)

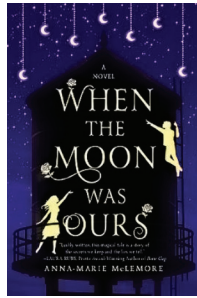

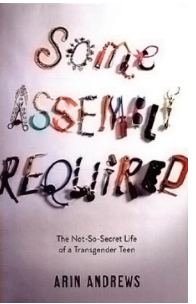
