Chair's Report

The Board adapted fairly quickly to the restrictions imposed by Covid. The last meeting I (Ian Keenan) attended in person was a Board consultative meeting on the Strategic Plan on February 15th, 2020. I also attended the 35th annual Preservation Awards of Heritage Winnipeg at the James Avenue Pumping Station on February 18th, 2020, where the WPL received an award for the restoration and refurbishment of the St. John's Library.

From the May 5th, 2020 Board meeting on, LAC chairs or an LAC representative were invited to attend Board meetings as guests - I attended each meeting until November 2020. The December meeting did not include guests.

The two most significant gains the Board was able to make despite Covid were:

- 1. The creation of a Strategic Plan for 2020 through 2025. This can be viewed online on the Board website. The plan is guided by the creation of SMART goals: Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, Time-based. Much of the committee work on the Strategic Plan was guided by Carla Epp, who is unfortunately no longer on the Board. Part of the new Strategic Plan involves the setting and attaining if specific goals each year. One of these goals has already been accomplished and is the 2nd major gain made by the Board for 2021:
- 2. Members of the Board made a presentation to City Council in support of eliminating library late fines. This elimination has become part of the City's multi-year budget going forward. Ed Cuddy, Mgr. of Library Services, has been advocating this for several years and is particularly proud of accomplishing this. He was able to use statistics collected during the WPL response to Covid to reinforce his case. Again, the Board Strategic Plan can be viewed online.

As you will have noted as part of the Agenda, the Board asks that the current year Strat. Plan goals be a standing agenda item at each LAC meeting. The Board's hope is to involve the LACs to a much greater degree, both as a source of suggestions and as a way to implement actions. That's my final Chair's report.
