The Writer-in-Residence provides online and in-person consultation with new, emerging, and established writers of all genres from an office in the Millennium Library.

Submit your Manuscript

Include a cover letter with a brief description of your writing background and any specific feedback you would like, as well as all contact information including an email address.

Manuscripts must follow strict submission guidelines: typed in 12-point font, prose -- double-spaced, not exceeding 15 pages, poetry -- single-spaced, not exceeding six poems.

From October 1, 2018 to March 15, 2019, manuscripts for review can be emailed to wpl.writerinres@gmail.com or a copy can be dropped off at the Reader Services desk at the Millennium Library or mailed to: Writer-in-Residence, Reader Services, 251 Donald Street, Winnipeg, MB R3C 3P5.

* Printed submissions must be copies as they will not be returned.

Jordan will contact writers to follow up directly.

The Writer-in-Residence service is free.
