Submit your Manuscript

Include a cover letter with a brief description of your writing background and any specific feedback you would like, as well as all contact information including an email address.

Manuscripts must follow strict submission guidelines: typed in 12-point font; prose -- double-spaced, no more than 15 pages; poetry -- single-spaced, no more than six poems.
