4. Youth Services Update

The TD Summer Reading Club and Teen Summer Challenge will run June 10 - August 30. Beginning June 10 children ages 0-12 can pick up a free bilingual reading kit and teens a bilingual summer challenge card at any library branch. On June 10 customers can also register for summer programs for children, teens, and families taking place July 2 – August 30.

Highlights of upcoming programming this summer include author visits from David A. Robertson, S.M. Beiko, and Michael Redhead Champagne, as well as a return of World Language Story Time and the World Storytelling Series. Thank you to the Winnipeg Public Library Board for funding World Language Story Time and the World Storytelling Series this summer.

June is Pride Month. Both the <u>Rainbow Reads for Children</u> and the <u>Rainbow Reads for Teens</u> are being updated with new titles this year, sharing the wonderful 2SLGBTQIA+ books in the library collection.

May was Asian Heritage Month. Vietnamese Canadian author Linda Trinh visited the Fort Garry Library for an author reading with students from General Byng School, Thank you to the Asian Heritage Society, The Writers' Union of Canada, and the Canada Council for the Arts for supporting this event.

The Spring Early Literacy Session (April 8 – May 18) included 391 programs over 5 weeks with a total of 7,923 attendees.

The Winnipeg Public Library Board welcomes Eric Fontaine, Branch Head Librarian of Transcona Library

Summary of presentation

- Eric started at Winnipeg Public Library in October 2022 as an Information Reference Librarian at Millennium Library
- As of May 2023, Eric has been the Branch Head Librarian of Transcona Library
- Library branch was part of the Library redevelopment strategy and reopened in its new location in March 2019
- Since reopening, circulation statistics have seen a significant increase
- There is a living wall and customers enjoy reading by the plants
- Seven study tables are well used during regular hours
- Programming includes several early literacy programs, 2 adult book clubs, tween book club, and much more
- Staff are involved in program delivery and display creation
- Eric thanks and acknowledged all Transcona Library staff on their creativity, dedication, and commitment to getting materials to customers
- Transcona Biz added a bike repair station and across the street the CN 2747 (first steam locomotive constructed at the Transcona shops) can be located
