3. Recruitment

4. Upcoming Library Hours

- Monday, November 11 all library branches are closed
- Friday, November 15 Millennium Library closes at 4:30 pm (instead of 5pm) for safety drills
- Wednesday, December 4 all library branches are closed

5. Library Website Redevelopment Project

- Library Services Division has received approval to proceed with a major renewal of the Library's website in 2025.
- Public engagement survey will be added to the Library's website, as well pushed out on social media and shared in-branch at service desks.
- We'll send a link to the survey when posted.

6. Youth Services Update

- Our 9-week Fall Early Literacy Session is running from October 1-December 2 and includes 65 early literacy sessions (Baby Rhyme Time, Toddler Time, and Family Story Time) across all 20 branches. To date, over 5,800 attendees were recorded. Registration for the Winter Early Literacy Session will open on December 9 and will run for 9 weeks from January 13-March 17.
- Youth Services Librarians delivered a 3-hour Early Literacy Program Training Session on October 22, which was attended by 15 staff members across the division. Another session will be offered on November 20.
- Our Makers-in-Residence delivered the following programs for children in October:
 - Origami Workshop with Janet Murata was held on October 19 at Munroe Library for children ages 6-12 with a caregiver and was attended by 13 people.
 - Make a Book Workshop with Tracy Charette Fehr was held on October 21 at Fort Garry Library for children ages 6-12 with a caregiver and was attended by 7 people.
- WPL has once again partnered with the Winnipeg Humane Society for the See Spot Read program. The program pairs elementary school children with therapy dogs at the Library. The dogs are reading buddies for students who have been selected by reading clinicians at their school to participate in the program. The fall session of this weekly program runs from October 10-December 13 at Sir William Stephenson Library and West Kildonan Library.

7. Adult Programming and Outreach Update

- Attendance at adult programs has been consistently high with many programs at full registration. The Maker-in-Residence workshops, Learn Michif, book clubs and genealogy workshops have been particularly well attended.
- The Winnipeg 150 Trivia Nights were well received at Millennium and Henderson Libraries. The Winnipeg 150 themed prizes including 3D printed "brain" trophies were appreciated.
- The Library Happy Hour on October 30 at Little Brown Jug was a huge success with standing room only. This "adult story time" features librarians reading short stories with a pop-up library of books to borrow and membership sign-ups. It is held 3-4 times a year.
- English Conversations Groups will be wrapping up in early December to return in the new year. New this term was an online ECG for Ukrainian-speaking newcomers only. These ECGs are led by volunteers with branch assistance and coordinated by an Outreach Librarian.
- Upcoming events:
 - Millennium Library's Out Loud at the Library choral series in partnership with Virtuosi Concerts continues November 9 and December 7 at 2 pm. Plans are underway to continue concert series in 2025
 - Outreach Services planned events include visits to Turtle Island Neighbourhood Centre, Tuxedo Family Centre, and Red River College Polytechnic along with the usual Mobile Library programs.

- The Winnipeg Public Library Board welcomed Rita Burgess, Past President of the Friends of the Winnipeg Public Library (Friends of WPL)
- Bio
 - $\circ~$ Rita is a dedicated advocate for community engagement and a library enthusiast
 - She has over 45 years of experience in financial planning, sales management, and employee development
 - Her volunteerism includes more than five years on the Friends of WPL Board of Directors, volunteering for the Winnipeg and Calgary United Way, the Dream Factory, Salvation Army, and Special Olympics.
 - She served on the Winnipeg Public Library Board from 2007 to 2012 where two years was served as Chair
 - In addition, she served as Vice-President on the Manitoba Library Trustees' Association
 - In 2012, Rita was the recipient of the Manitoba Library Services Award which celebrated her significant contributions to the Manitoba's library community.
- The Friends of WPL has a Board of Directors that oversees the operations of the organization
- The mandate is to fundraise for programs and special projects for Winnipeg Public Library but does not provide funds for capital projects
- There Friends of WPL has various fundraising activities and events but primarily funds are raised through the annual Big Book Sale

- In consultation with Library Administration, the Friends of WPL have provided \$391,000 in support of WPL projects and activities since 2000 namely:
 - Write-in-Residence program (since 2000 contributed \$63,750)
 - Spring break family programming (since 2006 contributed \$44,000)
- Other funded projects:
 - 9 family literacy playgrounds
 - Reading Nook at Bill and Helen Norrie Library in memory of Friends of WPL past President Rochelle Blumental
 - o Seven sewing machines in the ideaMILL
 - o Indigenous painting of buffalo for Charleswood Library's children's area
 - Floor seating for Baby Rhyme Time / Toddler time for various branches
 - o Bar height table for reading room at Cornish Library
 - Program support and prizes for 2024 Summer reading program
 - I Love to Read Month for February and spring break programming for 2025
