- Kathleen introduced herself and her role of Administrative Coordinator of Community Outreach and Marketing. In addition to her primary roles, she is the libraries media liaison, coordinates outreach services and adult programming. She has been with Winnipeg Public Libraries (WPL) since 2002 in various roles and was a librarian with Halifax Public Library (Nova Scotia) for 7 years prior to WPL.
- Marketing / Communications
 - o @TheLibrary July/August newsletter is now available in print and online
 - 16,750 copies are printed bi-monthly hardcopy requests by community groups have increased although overall amounts printed have decreasing.
 - The online e-newsletter is increasing in popularity as well with approximately 6,000
 7,000 copies downloaded of every issue from http://wpl.winnipeg.ca/library/
 - o Patrons are able to subscribe to newsletters, events and programs
 - There is a marketing committee that meets regularly to discuss strategies to promote WPL and to keep initiatives moving
 - WPL works with Corporate Communications for press releases and also promotes through outlets such as Winnipeg Free Press, Winnipeg Sun, the Metro, free online calendars, community networks, postering and social media

- Adult Programing
 - WPL has targeted and general programming to offer adults. Feedback is constantly being received which WPL uses to create new programs and improve existing
 - In 2013, it was reported that 3,100 programs were offered by WPL with 73,000 attendees. Of these programs, 967 were for adults with 21,000 attendees.

Target Adult Programs

- Looks to provide programming to certain groups or organizations both in the library and out in the community
- Community outreach unit provides daily programs to seniors, newcomers,
 Aboriginal peoples, low income and others who may not have access to the library
 (For example: Siloam Mission visits; Check it Out! mobile library program for low income areas; mobile library visits to 17 senior residences every month; homebound program for those unable to get to a library)
- A Government of Manitoba certified Adult Literacy Program runs at West End Library.
- English Conversation Groups, orientation workshops and creative writing workshops for newcomers

General Adult Programs

- Provides programming to the general public offered by library staff or through partnerships in all 20 libraries
- Programs meet goal of promoting library use, encourage lifelong learning and literacy, celebrate arts and culture, build community capacity, technology and computer workshops
- Try not to duplicate existing programs in the community.
- Several long running successful series include Skywalk Concerts and Lectures, and book clubs have expanded to almost every library including cookbook clubs, and even a knitting book club.
- The WPL in 2013 participated with the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC) and the Canadian Museum for Human Rights in the Human Library event. For more information please visit: http://wpl.winnipeg.ca/library/humanlibrary.asp
- The WPL Board's Jack Montgomery grant focus to provide grants for initiatives like writing workshops and/or writing authors
- The WPL offers a chance for adults to upgrade their literacy through the West End Library Learning (WELL) program. For more information please visit: http://wpl.winnipeg.ca/library/WELL.asp

- Theatre+ Arts Pass is a unique program to provide access to complimentary theatre and arts tickets to WPL cardholders.
 - Piloted from February June 2014
 - Feedback was received from borrowers and partners
 - Pass will run again for a new season starting September 2014 and will continue as long as feasible and feedback continues to be positive for borrowers and partners

- Outreach Services

- There are 17 sites that are dedicated to seniors where a mobile program of large type books and audiobooks are provided and sign up for library cards
- Check it Out! is a program that offers a range of popular books for all ages twice a
 month to low income areas. Books can be borrowed, no overdue fines, and a program
 is offered alongside with literacy games. There are four inner city sites currently:
 Dufferin School, Norquay Community Centre, Indigenous Family Centre and Blake
 Gardens Resource Centre (MB Housing).
- There are presentations that are offered to show patrons on how to use WPL services (e.g. how to use eBooks, how to use online services, introduction to your library).
 Three outreach librarians cover the city with presentations and hands-on workshops to a wide range of organizations and groups.
- Homebound program allows for patrons who qualify for the program to have books brought to and returned for them. Patrons are matched with a library staff member to help assist to pick out titles. Currently there are 30 volunteers who assist with this program.

1. Inspiring Ideas Campaign

The library is in the last two weeks of the public phase of our consultation process. We will collect surveys from the public in paper and electronic form up until July 15, 2014. To date we have 3491 surveys input electronically. There are still a number of paper surveys to be input. As our target is 5,000 surveys, we need the Board's help to completed. If you have not filled out a survey (or know someone whose has not filled out a survey) please consider filling one out before July 15. If you know someone who is not a user of the library, please encourage them to fill out a survey. We would like to know why they are not users, and what we should be doing to attract them to use our services.

2. Facilities

a. Charleswood Library

Construction is underway at the new Charleswood Library. People in the area are curious about what is happening in the malls and when the library will be opening. On Saturday June 21 the library attended an event held by Councillor Havixbeck at the Charleswood fire hall next to the library. The library had display boards of the new library on site and was also handing out Inspiring Ideas bookmarks. Many people expressed great excitement for the new library and offered to fill out the survey.

b. St. James Library

Renovations are on target to be completed shortly at the St. James Library. New carpeting and painting is being completed and a new service counter is being installed. The building is anticipated to open the week of July 7, 2014.
