- In 2017 the branch circulated 372,122 items resulting in a monthly average of 31,000 circulated items per month
- Children programming is very popular customers which consists of 5 ongoing programs
- The branch has a Youth Advisory Council (YAC) and a dedicated Tween-Book-Club
- The branch is a well used community place where customers come to study, get together, brainstorm and work on projects
- There has been an increased presence of new Canadians coming to the Branch where they can access a wide range of services and resources which include EAL resources, computer, internet, MS Word, scan and fax
- The branch is trying to have more outreach activities to connect in the community; staff have attended events like Happy Days on Henderson, Health Expo and Good Neighbours Active Living Centre

1. Facilities Update

a) Windsor Park Library

- The new branch is buzzing and we expect attendance and activity to increase!
- The back yard area will be landscaped in the spring

b) St. Vital Library

- We expect to receive the occupancy permit soon and anticipate opening in late May
- I will inform the Board and LACs as soon as the details are confirmed.

c) Transcona Library

- Construction work continues and site servicing (water, gas) has started
- On track for opening in August/September 2018

d) River Heights Library

A RFP for design of the new library is in progress and will go out in April/May 2018

e) Carnegie Library renovations

St. John's:

- Renovation project continues
- Anticipated re-opening date is late 2018

Cornish:

- We have just secured the building permit and will announce the temporary closure date soon
- I will inform the Board and LACs as soon as the details are confirmed.
- The library will be closed for about one year after the start of construction

g) Pembina Trail Library Renovation

- Closing Saturday May 5 at 5 p.m. for renovations
- The renovations include an upgraded entrance, universally accessible washrooms, improved shelving and collections layout, and a new location for the book return. There will be new furniture, paint, flooring and a single service desk
- Holds will be sent to Fort Garry Library during the closure unless customers direct their holds to a different branch
- Anticipated reopening will be fall 2018
