- The Winnipeg Public Library Board welcomes Stephanie Graham, Branch Head Librarian of St. Vital Library
- Previously the Branch Head of St. James-Assiniboia Library and Youth Services Librarian at West Kildonan Library
- In addition to Branch Head duties, she assists in creating various staff training materials
- Branch information
 - The building was designed by George A. Stewart and was created for the specific plot of land that the former St. Vital Library Board had purchased from the City of Winnipeg
 - o It was opened by Duff Roblin in June 1963
 - o Received Heritage Winnipeg Preservation award on February 18, 2019
 - Renovations began in 2015 with the first phase to install an elevator to make the building accessible
 - o Renovations continued in 2017 and reopened on May 28, 2018
 - In 2014, the building received Municipal Heritage designation; any work done to the building was in consultation with the Historical Building Committee
- Program information
 - Offers both adult and children programming
 - Most popular program is baby rhyme time
 - o Also offer Time for Twos and Family Story Time
 - o There is an adult book club available which has been running since 2000
 - o There is an English Conversation group that is offered
 - Special programs include The History of River Park and Elm Park, Effective Tax Strategies and Companion Gardening
- Staff also engage with the community by connecting with neighbourhood organizations such as YMCA, St. Vital Historical Society and St. Vital Parent and Child Coalition

Manager's Report March 5, 2019

1. Facilities Update

a) Transcona Library

- Opening March 7, 2019 at 10 a.m. The official ceremony starting at 10:30 a.m.
- Thanks to the Board and the East Kildonan-Transcona Library Advisory Committee for their generous donation of flowers and gift cards for refreshments.

b) Carnegie Library renovations

St. John's:

- We are awaiting the production and installation of doors and associated hardware
- Completion of construction is estimated for late May 2019.

- We are planning to replace the library roof immediately after the general contractor has completed their project. The attic and roof work is expected to take about two weeks to complete.
- Library Services intends to keep the branch closed until all work is concluded and anticipate reopening St. John's Library in early summer.

Cornish:

- Construction work (associated with the main construction contract) is scheduled to begin in mid-late April 2019.
- Asbestos remediation contracts have been tendered and awards are pending. The remediation work is planned to be performed in March.
- Final riverbank stabilization work is pending federal approval and will take place immediately before or after the project is completed.

c) River Heights Library / Bill & Helen Norrie Library

 Approaching completion of design phase. Public engagement open house will be scheduled for mid-April 2019. The invitation will be extended to the Board and LACs.

d) St. Vital Library

2. Millennium Library Screening Procedures

On February 25, 2019, Library Services implemented new screening procedures at Millennium Library.

The City of Winnipeg Library Services' mission is "To enrich the lives of all Winnipeg citizens and their communities by providing high quality, responsive and innovative library services." It is also accountable for providing safe and welcoming environments for all staff and customers. Library Services introduced the new screening measures at Millennium Library with the goal of improving safety for everyone who visits. This decision was based on a marked increase in the frequency and severity of incidents over the past few years; most significantly, increases in incidents involving intoxication, substance use and violent or threatening behaviour.

The Millennium Library remains open and accessible to all. The front lobby area is open extended hours so that people can take shelter from extreme temperatures. The Library also has two community crisis workers on staff who are qualified to assist and assess as required. City staff and crisis workers continually reach out to social organizations to discuss ideas on how to reduce harm and develop programs and services to reach vulnerable people in the library.

Library Services has been receptive to feedback on the implementation of these new security measures and will review procedures on a continued basis to ensure their effectiveness.

3. New Card Application Form

WPL staff have reviewed and revised the membership card application form. Notable changes made to the form were to remove gender and to streamline some of the questions. The new form will roll-out in March.

4. 1919 General Strike Program Series

Millennium Library is hosting a lunch hour series that delves into the history and lasting impacts of the Winnipeg General Strike. The program is run in partnership with the Winnipeg General Strike 100th Anniversary Committee, Paul Moist and Sharon Reilly. The series run on four Wednesdays from noon – 1 p.m., March 20 – April 1., in the Carol Shields Auditorium.
