Guest Highlights April 6, 2021

- The Winnipeg Public Library Board welcomed Michael Redhead Champagne and Mary Burton from <u>Fearless R2W</u>
- Fearless R2W is partnering with Winnipeg Public Library (WPL) and other organizations to implement a pilot program (Community Host Program)
- The community host program is an alternative to traditional security
- Changes point of view of protecting the physical building but viewing the library as community space for all
- The program will provide training and work experience for Indigenous youth aging out of care
- The primary goals will focus on pre-employment skills, confidence building, and security guard/community building training
- The model will include de-escalating training and is holistic it will be conflict prevention/management/resolution based that serves all parties the community, individuals that the service comes in contact with, and the client
- WPL is committed to the project and is a core partner in the project planning team
- Interns will be paid for 13-weeks and will be placed either at Millennium Library, St. Boniface Library, or St. John's Library

Q&A

What is the age that is considered aging out of care?

- 18 years old, unless an extension is granted and then it is 21 years old.

Is there an opportunity for the interns to learn more about library services while working?

- Yes, interns will hopefully learn about their placements to develop knowledge and be able to answer certain questions (e.g., provide suggestions, did you know). It is important that interns not only build a relationship with customers but with staff.

Do the trainers within Fearless R2W come from marginalized backgrounds or aging out of the system life experience?

- Yes, it is important that trainers have lived experience to help youth navigate the system and provide mentorship to them.

Is Fearless R2W involved in the community talks about Millennium Library security?

- Yes, we are involved with the discussion group.

2. WPL Update

WPL continues to offer holds pickup and returns, reference and CIO outreach services. The Library is working to fill several full and part-time vacancies, including 5 branch head positions at Fort Garry, Sir William Stephenson, West Kildonan, Cornish and Osborne libraries.

Library staff participated in the planning and delivery of Anti-Racism Week, including programming the first virtual Human Library at WPL. While the week was well-received, this is just a first step towards eliminating racism and oppression in the City of Winnipeg.

3. Friends of the Winnipeg Public Library Update

The Friends of the Winnipeg Public Library will be reopening the Best of Friends Gift Shop (in the lobby of the Millennium Library) on Thursday April 8th. The Gift Shop will be operating Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays from 11:00 to 4:00pm. Appointments are preferred, as they are able to have only one customer at a time in the shop. Further information can be found on the Friends website (friendswpl.ca). FWPL, with the proceeds of the BOF Gift Shop, helps to support WPL by funding

literacy playgrounds (such as at BAHN Library), support for the Writer-In-Residence program, along with other WPL special projects.

We would also like to welcome incoming President Rita Burgess and thank Kathy Blight as the former President for her work. Kathy will continue to manage the Best of Friends Gift Shop.

4. CELA/NNELS Funding

Earlier this year, the <u>Centre for Equitable Library Access (CELA)</u> and <u>National Network for Equitable Library Service (NNELS)</u> announced that their federal funding was being cut. The organizations launched a campaign to restore their funding.

On March 16, Minister of Employment, Workplace Development and Disability Inclusion, Carla Qualtrough <u>released a statement</u> restoring \$1 million in funding for accessible reading materials for the upcoming 2021-2022 budget year to CELA and NNELS. However, funding after 2022 is not guaranteed.

If the Winnipeg Public Library Board and Library Advisory Committees are interested, they can participate in advocating for sustainable federal funding for the two groups by passing a motion and also sharing information on social media accounts. Annabel would assist in coordinating and providing information.

5. Fearless R2W Project

Backgrounder information provided.

Summary: Fearless R2W would like to partner with Winnipeg Public Library to start a Community Safety Host program. The pilot program will provide be a supportive employment transition for Indigenous youth aging out of the care. St. Boniface Library and St. John's Library would be host worksites.

Winnipeg Public Library has committed \$15,000 in funding for intern wages during the pilot at Winnipeg select WPL locations. Winnipeg Public Library is requesting the Board's assistance with providing this funding.
