Winnipeg Public Library provides engaging programs and a rich variety of collections through 20 locations and online at [winnipeg.ca/library](http://winnipeg.ca/library). Library cards are free if you live in Winnipeg.

- The library has **resources for all ages** and reading levels. You and your learners may be particularly interested in the Literacy (ABE), Learn English (ESL/EAL), and Juvenile Dual Language (JDL) collections. General library collections of interest include books, magazines and newspapers in several languages, audio books, movies and children's resources (books for baby, ABC/123 books, picture books and more).

From the Library's website, you can use 30+ information databases, search the catalogue, manage your account and use language learning tools such as Active Reading, Tense Buster, Study Skills Success, Tumblebooks (read-along eBooks).
