Welcome to Winnipeg Public Library

A public library is a place where everyone is welcome. At the library you and your family can find information; read, relax or study; ask questions; attend a program; borrow books, movies, music, and more!



ideaMILL

The ideaMILL makerspace is located on the 3rd floor of Millennium Library. The space is to work on projects and access computers and software, 3D printers, sewing machines, photography and video equipment, sound booths for recording, and more.

Getting a library card

- Visit any
 Winnipeg
 Public Library
 branch.
- Library cards are free for City of

Winnipeg residents. Every member of your family can have their own card.

- Bring identification such as a Manitoba Health Card, driver's license, or a utility bill with your name and current address on it.
- You can get a Limited Library Card if you do not have identification.

With your library card

- You can borrow items from any of Winnipeg Public Library's 20 branches.
- You and your family can borrow books, music, video games, movies, and audiobooks. You can borrow dual language books and books in over 20 languages (most are at Millennium Library).
- You can borrow most items for 21 days.
 You can borrow up to 100 items at a time.
 Limited card holders can borrow up to 2 items at a time.
- You can return items to any branch. All branches have a book return for after-hours returns.

At the library

- You can use the free WiFi and internet computers at any library branch.
- Libraries have programs and events for children, adults, and families. You can attend English Conversation Groups, book clubs, story times, computer classes, and more. Ask at your library about what programs they have. You may need to register. All library programs are free.
- There are online resources too, at winnipeg.ca/library. You can listen to and read books, magazines, and watch movies.
- All 20 branches have books in French.
 St. Boniface Library offers services and programs in both French and English.

- You can try to renew your items if you need to keep them longer:

- Download the Winnipeg Public Library app
- Ask library staff to renew your items
- Call our TeleMessaging service at 204-986-4657 (in Winnipeg) or 1-866-826-4454 (outside Winnipeg, toll free)

We do not charge overdue fines. Please return items on time. You will be charged the replacement cost for items not returned, or returned damaged.
