## Author Spotlight

**David Bergen** grew up in the small fishing village of Port Edward, B.C., and the town of Niverville, Manitoba. He attended Red River College in Winnipeg, where he studied creative communications, and taught high school English at Kelvin High School until 2002. He also served as Writer-in-Residence at the Millennium (then Centennial) Library in 2002-2003. His work has been nominated for a Governor General's Literary Award, the IMPAC Dublin Literary Award, and a Pushcart Prize. In 2005, his novel *The Time in Between* won the Scotiabank Giller Prize.

**Carol Shields** was born in Oak Park, Illinois, in 1935, Carol Shields moved to Canada following her marriage to Don Shields, a Canadian engineer. In the summer of 1980, the Shields family moved to Winnipeg, where they would be based for the next twenty years. During that time Shields taught English at the University of Manitoba (1982-2000) and served as Chancellor of the University of Winnipeg (1996-2000).

She spent the final three years of her life in Victoria, B.C., where she died at the age of 68. Shields wrote non-fiction, poetry, and plays, but she remains best known as a fiction writer. Her novels, among which *The Republic of Love* and *Larry's Party* are set at least partially in Winnipeg, were nominated for and won multiple literary awards including the Governor General's Award, the National Book Critics' Circle Prize, the Orange Prize, and the Pulitzer Prize.

Among her many other honours and namesakes, the Carol Shields Auditorium in the Millennium Library is proof of the high regard in which she came to be held in the city in which she wrote her best known work.

**katherena vermette** is a Red River Métis (Michif) writer from Treaty 1 territory, the heart of the Métis Nation, Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada. She was born in Winnipeg and her Michif roots on her paternal side run deep in St. Boniface, St. Norbert and beyond. Her first book, *North End Love Songs*, won the Governor General's Literary

Award for Poetry in 2013. Since then, her work has garnered awards and critical accolades across genres. Her trio of linked novels set in Winnipeg - *The Break*, *The Strangers*, and *The Circle* - have been national best sellers and won multiple literary awards.
