Melanie is the author of *Goose* (Assembly, 2025), *The Rough Poets: Reading Oil-Worker Poetry* (McGill-Queen's UP, 2024), and *Happiness Threads: The Unborn Poems* (The Muses' Company, 2013). With the other members of the Land and Labour Poetry Collective, Melanie co-edited the poetry anthology *I'll Get Right On It: Poems on Working Life in the Climate Crisis* (Roseway, 2025).
