



Maker-in-Residence: Cyanotype Workshop

Cyanotypes are a historical form of photography, using UV light exposure to develop images. Participants will paint a negative image on a transparency sheet, which will block UV light. When the painted transparency is layered over the cyanotype paper and exposed to light, the unpainted portions will become vibrant blue.
