

Maker-in-Residence: Linocut Workshop

Many of our personal traditions are important because of the repetition, not necessarily the activity itself. With lino printing, students will create many twin cards to share with folks they love. Linocut printing uses soft linoleum which artists carve images into, then roll ink over the surface of the carved plate and press onto a card. The image carved will appear on each card, with mild variation.
