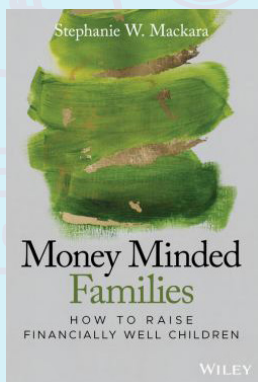


Financial Literacy Month
