










EXISTING FASCIA AT ROOF TRANSITION

The historic white fascia is a decorative element of the building and a Heritage defining element. Areas of the fascia are currently rusted and deteriorated. This fascia will be removed, cleaned, reinstalled or repaired and painted in the overall refresh of the building.
