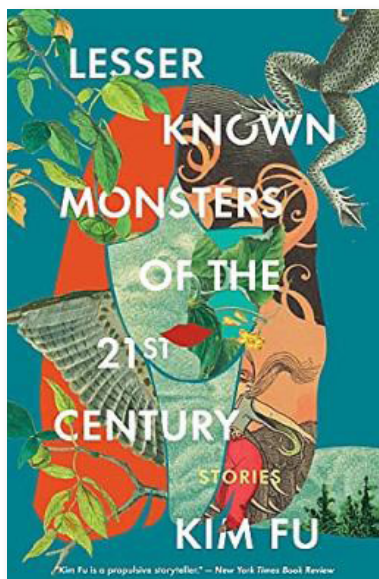

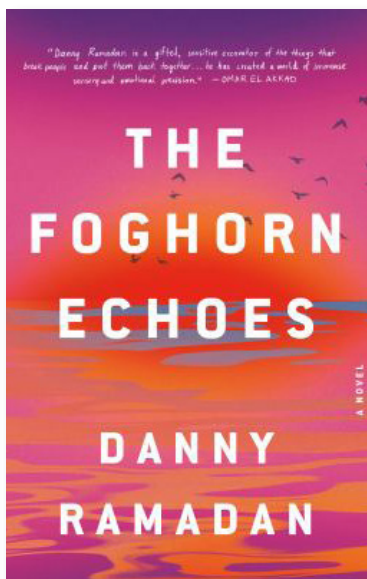

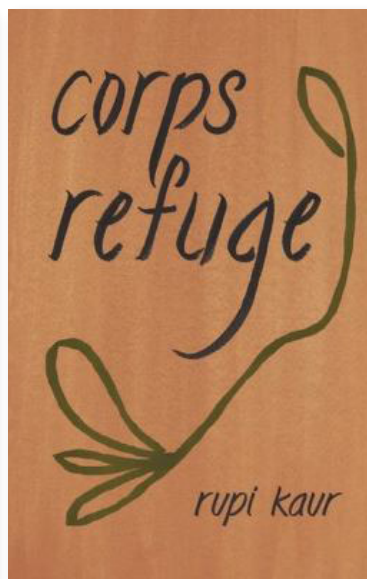

Kuljinder Kaur Brar is an elementary school teacher. Born and raised in British Columbia, she is the daughter of Sikh immigrants from Punjab, India. Her debut picture book, *My Name is Saajin Singh*, was born out of her desire to change the lack of representation of Sikh protagonists in books.

Rupi Kaur was born in Punjab, India and moved to Canada as a child. She is a poet and illustrator. Her notable best-selling works are *milk and honey* and *the sun and her flowers*. Her poems have been translated into over 30 languages.
