Talk • Sing • Read • Write • Play


Early experiences with books and language lay the foundation for success in learning to read. You can help build reading readiness. Talk, sing, read, write and play with your child - all of these activities help to develop language and literacy skills. Use this list of recommended stories to celebrate the joy of reading with your child.

Join weekly sessions of Baby Rhyme Time program for babies 0-18 months with a caregiver that features a playful approach to language development by sharing rhymes, songs, simple stories and early literacy tips designed to help families develop early literacy skills every day.


Early Literacy Tips

- Read with your baby every day. Your baby will learn that reading and spending time together is important.
- Make reading time a warm and happy experience. If your baby loses interest, put the book away for another time.
- Point to objects in the book's illustrations and tell your baby what you see.
- Sing songs to your baby, this slows down language so they hear the different sounds that make up words.
- Talking with babies is a brain-building activity! Babbles, coos, laughter, smiles, looks, and gestures are all ways that your baby talks back to you.
