Tips to encourage early math skills

- Have fun with math. Make exploring letters and numbers a warm and fun experience.
- Read books with numbers in them. If it's a counting book, take time to count with your child.
- Point out numbers everywhere you see them – on signs, labels, and even at the grocery store. Show children how you use numbers every day.
- Sing songs with children. Songs that rhyme, repeat or have numbers in them are tons of fun! Songs also help children learn about patterns.
- Take children to the library regularly. Libraries are a wonderful place to explore numbers, counting, math and more!
